Lions Clubs Health Foundation is again the event organizer. All proceeds stay locally benefiting people who live with diabetes in our community.

There are 20-mile (Lil), 40-mile (Classic), 70-mile (Stretch) and 100-mile (Century) routes. The 100-mile riders start 6:00 to 6:30 AM, 70-mile riders start 6:30 to 7:30 AM, 40-mile riders start 7:30 to 8:30 AM, and the 20-mile rider start from 8:30 to 10:00 AM.

We are looking for 2 Net Control Operators, 4 Rest Stops and 11 SAG drivers, and 1 Bike Path Rider (bicycle), if possible.

SAG's: (Support and Gear) drive a dedicated section of the route and assist with breakdowns. This may include transporting the bike(s) and rider(s) to the nearest Rest Stop, Assist with changing or airing up tires, etc. A Pickup Truck, SUV or a vehicle with a bike rack is preferred.

Rest Stops: Remain at the assigned Rest Stop and radio the needs of the rest stop personnel back to base. Also, if a rider calls it the day at a rest stop, you will radio net control to route a SAG to the Rest Stop to transport the rider back to base.

Bike Path: Bike Path rider is the same as SAG, with one difference. This volunteer will be on a bicycle patrolling back and forth on the Bike Path between Humphrey Road and Acacia Ave. This being said, an HT with a spare battery or two would be ideal. Also, you will not be transporting anyone. Just call for a SAG to meet up and transport the Rider and their bike. NEW GENERAL CLASS QUESTION POOL

Effective July 1, 2023
The National Conference of Volunteer Examiner Coordinators'

(NCVEC) Question Pool Committee (QPC) has released the 2023 - 2027 General Class FCC Element 3 Syllabus and Question Pool to the public. The new General Question Pool is effective July 1, 2023, through June 30, 2027.

The new pool incorporates some significant changes compared to the 2019 - 2023 version. Its 432 questions were modified slightly to improve wording and to replace distractors; 51 new questions were generated, and 73 questions were eliminated. This resulted in a reduction of 22 questions, bringing the total number of questions in the pool down from 454. The level of difficulty of questions is more balanced, and the techniques and practices addressed have been updated.

The single graphic required for the new General Question Pool is available within the documents, or separately as PDF and JPG file formats.

"The newly revised pool must be used for General-class license exams starting July 1, 2023," said ARRL VEC Manager Maria Somma, AB1FM, who is a member of the NCVEC Question Pool Committee. "New test designs will be available to ARRL Volunteer Examiners on that date. The ARRL VEC will supply its officially appointed, field-stocked VE teams with new General exam booklet designs around mid-June."

General class examination candidates preparing for their exams

using the 9th edition of The General Class License Manual, and/or the 6th edition of ARRL's General Q & A are encouraged to test by, or before, June 30, 2023. New editions of ARRL licensing publications will be available in May, for exams taken on, or after, July 1, 2023.

VE TEST SESSION

Sat. Mar. 4, 2023 at 715 King Ave., Yuba City at 9:00 A.M. VE's are needed to administer the exam. The elements for Technician, General, and Extra class will be offered.

The exam requires two forms of ID.

At least one of them must be a picture ID. A fee of \$15.00 is required.

A calculator may be used as long as it has had all of its memories cleared and there are no built in or preprogrammed formulas.

Upgrades to a higher class also require two forms of ID. At least one of them must be a picture ID. Also, bring your license and a photocopy of the license.

If you take an exam and pass, you can take the next higher class exam for no additional cost.

If you do not pass and wish to try again an additional fee will be required.

Please Note: You must use a FCC Federal Registration Number (FRN) to take an exam and for any transactions with the FCC. You will need this number for the forms you'll complete. A FRN can be obtained at:

https://www.fcc.gov/licensingdatabases/commission-registrationsystem-fcc

Also note: new licensing fees are in effect. The fees will be the responsibility of the applicant regardless of filing method and must be paid within 10 calendar days of FCC's receipt of the application. For applications filed by a VEC, the period does not begin until the application is received bv Commission, а ULS file number assigned, and an email sent by the FCC directly to the applicant."

VECs and Volunteer Examiner (VE) teams will not collect the \$35 fee at license exam sessions. New and

upgrade candidates at an exam session will continue to pay the \$15 exam session fee to the ARRL VE team as usual, and pay the new, \$35 application fee directly to the FCC by using the CORES FRN Registration system.

When the FCC receives examination information from the VEC, it will email а link with payment instructions successful to each candidate who then will have calendar days from the date of the email to pay. After the fee is paid and the FCC has processed an application. examinees will receive a second email from the FCC with a link to their official license or explanation of other action. The link will be good for 30 days.
