CQP has traditionally opened the annual contest season by providing an opportunity for contesters to prepare for the ARRL November Sweepstakes since the format is similar.

Stations outside of California, worldwide, work stations in California only. The 58 counties of CA are the multipliers. California stations work all stations in or out of CA. The 50 US states and 8 Canadian areas are the multipliers. Stations outside of Canada and the US add to one's QSO total but do not count as multipliers. FCC EXTRA CLASS QUESTION POOL REVISED AS OF 07/01/2024

The ARRL Extra Class License Manual, 13th edition, is now available. Questions and answers are valid through 07/30/2028.

If you are going to be taking the Amateur Extra exam be sure you are studying from the new question pool.

VE TEST SESSION

At the last VE session only one person tested. He took all three elements and passed the Technician and General class elements. Congratulations to Alexander J. (Jay) Hyatt III (KO6FRJ) who received his General class license.

The next VE session will be Sat., Sept. 7th at 715 King Ave., Yuba City at 9:00 A.M. VE's are needed to administer the exam. The elements for Technician,

General, and Extra class will be offered.

The exam requires two forms of ID. At least one of them must be a picture ID. A fee of \$15.00 is required. Please Note: You must have a FCC Federal Registration Number (FRN) to take an exam and for any transactions with the FCC. You will need this number for the forms you'll complete. You will not be allowed to take the exam without this number. A FRN can be obtained at:

https://www.fcc.gov/licensingdatabases/commission-registrationsystem-fcc

A calculator may be used as long as it has had all of its memories cleared and there are no built in or preprogrammed formulas.

Upgrades to a higher class also require two forms of ID. At least one of them must be a picture ID. Also, bring your license and a photocopy of the license.

If you take an exam and pass, you can take the next higher class exam at no additional cost.

If you do not pass and wish to try again an additional fee will be required.

fees Licensing will responsibility of the applicant regardless of filing method and must be paid within 10 calendar days of FCC's receipt of the application. For applications filed by a VEC, the period does not begin until the application is received bv the Commission. ULS а file number assigned, and an email sent by the FCC directly to the applicant."

VECs and Volunteer Examiner (VE)

teams will not collect the \$35 fee at license exam sessions. New and upgrade candidates at an exam session will continue to pay the \$15 exam session fee to the ARRL VE team as usual, and pay the new, \$35 application fee directly to the FCC by using the CORES FRN Registration system.

When FCC receives the the examination information from the VEC. it email а link with payment instructions to each successful candidate who then will have 10 calendar days from the date of the email to pay. After the fee is paid and the FCC has processed an application, examinees will receive a second email from the FCC with a link to their official license or explanation of other action. The link will be good for 30 days
